

MONC Northwest Regional Finals Sunday, March 4th in Seattle



Though a bit later than in previous years, the Metropolitan Opera National Council (MONC) Northwest Regional Finals will take place on March 4, 2018 in Seattle's Benaroya Hall at 1 pm. Eleven singers, including the three who advanced from the Oregon Auditions last October: sopranos Jasmin White (who sang for our Fall Luncheon) and Cara Gabrielson and mezzo-soprano Anne Maguire, will compete for prize money and the opportunity to advance to the National Finals at the Metropolitan Opera in New York in April. The other eight singers in Seattle won Regional Auditions in the Washington, Western (actually, all of) Canada, and Idaho/Montana Regions. This is a very exciting event, one that your Coloratura Editor will be on hand to cover once again. I hope that a number of you will be in the audience as well!

Currently, two judges, **Gregory Henkel**,
Managing Artistic Director of San Francisco
Opera, and **Bénédicte Jourdois**, a graduate of
the Lindemann Young Artist Development
Program who's currently on the Vocal Faculties of
both the Manhattan School of Music and Juilliard,
will be on hand to select the winning
competitor(s). **David McDade**, Head of Coach/
Accompanists for Seattle Opera, will provide piano
accompaniment for the 11 singers.

The Met in HD: 2018 Schedule

The Metropolitan Opera's very popular series, shown in High Definition in four Portland area cinemas, has four more broadcasts this season. All Saturday morning broadcasts begin at 10 am and are re-shown on the following Wednesday evenings at 6:30 pm.



Since then, she has become recognized as one of today's outstanding vocalists, excelling in the most demanding belicanto repertoire, as well as in the operas of Verdi and Mozart. This season, she sings the title roles of Bellini's *Norma* and Rossini's *Semiramide* at the Metropolitan Opera and Handel's *Alcina* with Washington National Opera in the company's first-ever staging of the work.

We Portlanders are so very fortunate to have a local organization devoted to Chamber Music that includes a vocal recital by a world-class operatic singer each year. In past years, FOCM (Friends of Chamber Music) has presented opera super-stars Gerald Finley, Eric Owens, Matthew Polenzani, and Susan Graham. On Thursday, April 4th at 7:30 pm, at PSU's Lincoln Performance Hall, the outstanding international star, tenor **Lawrence Brownlee** will offer a vocal recital. One of the most in-demand singers in the world today, Mr. Brownlee has appeared in most of the world's great opera houses and with several noted orchestras.



He will be accompanied by the acclaimed **Myra Huang**. *Opera News* says she is "among the top accompanists of her generation."

Mr. Brownlee's program includes Robert Schumann's wondrous and profound

Dichterliebe ("A Poet's Love") and a new song cycle being written for the tenor by Tyshawn
Sorey (with text by poet Terrance Hayes)
called Cycles of My Being. The piece was commissioned by Philadelphia and Carnegie Hall.

Ticket prices range from \$30-56, Anyone who has attended a concert of any kind at Lincoln Hall knows there's not a bad seat in the house.

Angel of the Amazon, Opera About Slain Nun, Sr. Dorothy Stang, at PSU Lincoln Hall February 28th



Performance of this new opera will be taking place at Portland State University Lincoln Hall, Room 75 at 10:00 am. Admission is free and open to the public. The opera depicts Sr. Dorothy's life-long work with the poor, helping them sustainably farm the Amazon Rainforest. Sr. Dorothy was an advocate for the Brazilian people who were targeted by loggers and landowners. Sr. Dorothy was martyred in Anapu, Para, Brazil in 2005.



Angel of the Amazon, composer Evan Mack, will be pianist for this production at PSU. "The opera's mission is to connect people to Sr. Dorothy's story on an

emotional level. My hopes are that through the power of story telling and music, audiences will make a greater bond to Dorothy's story and life work helping the poor."—Evan Mack.

Mezzo Soprano Heather Jones will sing the role of Sr. Dorothy. Baritone, and Portland native José Rubio reprises his role as Luiz from the premiere production of the opera. Composer, Evan Mack will be at the piano. The performance will feature Ivy Zhou, Beth Madsen Bradford, Brendan Tuohy, and Damien Geter.
