Portland Opera Celebrates its 50th Season

Portland Opera celebrates its 50th year with a five-opera 2014-15 season as it did in its very first season a half century ago, Johann Strauss' delightful Die Fledermaus sung in English will open the season.

In February 2015, perhaps the most popular opera in the entire repertory, George Bizet's *Carmen*, will be featured on the Keller stage. Showcasing 20 seasons of Broadway productions for Portland Opera, May will bring the great Hammerstein/Kern musical *Show Boat* to the Keller.

June will be another exciting month for Portland Opera. For the very first time in its history, Igor Stravinsky's *The Rake's Progress*, the composer's tribute to Mozart combining comedy and drama a la *Don Giovanni*, will receive three showings. This opera, too, will be sung in English. Moreover, running concurrently with the opera there will be an exhibition of drawings, watercolors and designs by the renowned artist, David Hockney who designed the sets and costumes for this opera.

The fifth opera of this fabulous season will take place in July-August. Donizetti's beautiful, light-hearted Elixir of Love will have six performances at the Newmark Theater with the Portland Opera Resident Artists singing all the leading roles.

This year, the esteemed panel of judges, all with long experience in that capacity, are Canadian mezzo-soprano Judith Forst, who at 24 debuted in *Rigoletto* at the Met in September, 1968, the same year she won at the MONC National Final Auditions, David Gately, who has been Stage Director of several recent productions at Dallas, Seattle, and Florida Grand Operas, and Richard Harrell, who "currently serves as 'Director of Heroes' Voices, a service organization for veterans which produces music and poetry workshops and facilitates collaborations with other service organizations that serve returning veterans." Mr. Harrell was previously Director of the Julliard and San Francisco Opera Centers.

For us, in the Portland area, the first step along the road Ms. Haslett traveled last year is at the MONC Oregon District Auditions.

None of us who were in the audience in Seattle's Benaroya Hall last January 19th will ever forget the excitement generated by our "rookie" soprano, Nicole Haslett, stepping onto the stage as the very first (of twelve) singers in the Metropolitan Opera National Council (MONC) Northwest Regional Auditions. After delivering two stunning arias by Donizetti and Verdi, Ms. Haslett had to wait for the others in the competition to perform two arias each, a 30-minute intermission, and perhaps another half hour for the judges to make and present their collective decision.

We Portlanders were thrilled at the announcement that Nicole was named recipient of the \$5,000 first prize and the only one to advance to the National Council Semi-Finals in New York. Indeed, a few members of the Portland Opera Guild followed her to New York and watched her move on from that competition into the Grand Finals Concert on the Met stage the following week. At the age of 26, Ms. Haslett is on the current



roster of Metropolitan Opera sopranos after a single year as a Portland Opera Resident Artist!

While we'll miss seeing her in Portland this season, we are very proud to know that she will sing during the current Met season.

MONC Oregon District Fundraiser

MONC Oregon District plans to produce the opera Bon Appetit by Lee Hoiby a one-woman opera transcribed from a classic Julia Child television broadcast – on January 31, 2015 at the Multnomah Athletic Club.

Our 'own' Christine Meadows will be starring as Julia In this "episode" we find the master chef teaching the makings of a classic French chocolate cake as only she can, and spectators who rarely find their way to an opera house will be surprised and delighted by a fully sung production with familiar musical themes and a hilarious, feverishly whisking chef who creates a masterpiece with flour flying and egg-beaters racing.

The opera is 18 minutes long and along with dinner will be a delightful time spent in support of Metropolitan Opera National Council Oregon District. Further details will be available in the next newsletter.

San Francisco Opera in HD

Portland Opera and the Oregon Museum of Science and Industry (OMSI) will collaborate to present "Opera on Screen," a series of high-definition film screenings featuring recent productions from the San Francisco Opera. The series opens on Friday, September 5 with Puccini's Madame Butterfly and continues with Mozart's Don Giovanni, Puccini's La Rondine, and Sampson and Delilah by Camille Saint-Saens.

The screenings take place at OMSI's recently renovated Empirical Theater, which features a four-story tall screen and a Dolby Atmos sound system, making it the most technologically advanced venue in the state. Each screening will be preceded by a special introduction given by a Portland Opera staff member.

An Angela Meade Summer in Oregon

Ah – summer in Oregon: long, warm, sunny days and a great time for outdoor events. For opera lovers in our area, it is a special time indeed. Appearing not once, but twice, on Oregon stages in June and August, 2014, was the northwest's reigning diva, a Centralia, Washington native and one of the world's outstanding sopranos, Angela Meade.

We, who live in this area, are so fortunate that Ms. Meade has been willing and able to get back here from time to time to perform in front of her local fan base. A standing-room only auditorium saw Ms. Meade and a stellar roster of cast members perform an abridged concert version of Giuseppe Verdi's La Traviata at Astoria, OR's Liberty Theater on June 14th. Singing her very first Violetta in that opera, Ms. Meade brought down the appreciative house on what was the opening day of the annual Astoria Music Festival.

The performance of *La Traviata* was made possible through the generosity of Jeannine B. Cowles, a lifetime member of the Portland Opera Guild and a major supporter of Portland Opera. The opera scene in our area would not be the same without Jeannine!

A much larger crowd, thousands strong, filled the Rose Garden amphitheater in Portland's Washington Park on a lovely Friday evening in August (the 8th) for Portland SummerFest's annual opera-in-the-park

event. Ms. Meade sang the title role in Vincenzo Bellini's bel canto masterpiece, *Norma*, a role which she sang at the Met last season and which has gained her world-wide acclaim! Richard Zeller, who sang Germont alongside Ms. Meade's Violetta in Astoria, performed the role of Oroveso in Norma. Mezzo-soprano Carla Dirlikov and tenor Allan Glassman added their fabulous voices to the evening's operatic event.

We cannot fail to note that Maestro, Keith Clark was at the podium directing the soloists, chorus, and orchestra in both Astoria and Portland. A connoisseur and superior interpreter of opera, Mr. Clark serves as Artistic Director of the Astoria Music Festival, which he co-founded along with long-time Opera Guild member Ruth Dobson. Mr. Clark directs the SummerFest opera production as well.

The Portland Opera Guild is a sizable supporter of Portland SummerFest, contributing \$3,000 to help bring great talent and exquisite music to the Rose City. The Guild was a definite presence at the August 8 opera, with a "membership table" to distribute materials and "talk opera" to potential new members. Quite a few of us were among the thousands who enjoyed the memorable opera-in-the park festivities.

Portland Opera Resident Artists

Portland Opera's new Resident Artist, soprano Katrina Galka, will join returnees, tenor lan Jose' Ramirez and baritone Alexander Elliott, for the 2014-15 opera season. Ms. Galka will "replace" Nicole Haslett, who, after winning the 2014 Metropolitan Opera National Council (MONC) competitions in Portland and Seattle, was chosen as one of ten Grand Finalists in New York and now has joined the Met roster of performing sopranos for the coming season! Neither will mezzosoprano Melissa Fajardo be returning to Portland for a second year. Portland Opera has decided not to enlist a new mezzo for the season.

Ms. Galka received an MA in Vocal Performance from Boston University earlier this year and has appeared with Opera Theatre of St. Louis for the past two seasons. She will appear on the Keller stage in two of the season's operas and is scheduled to give a recital at



the Art Museum's Whitsell Auditorium on Tuesday, March 31, 2015.

Returning tenor, Mr. Ramirez will sing roles in four of five Portland operas after having spent part of the summer at the Caramoor Center's Bel Canto Opera Program. Previous to that, he appeared with The Oregon Symphony and Opera Theater



of Oregon. Ian will be the first Resident Artist recitalist, appearing at the museum on Tuesday, October 21st.

Alexander Elliott returns to Portland Opera Residency after a busy and productive summer as a participant in San Francisco Opera's renowned Merola Program. Like Mr. Ramirez, the young baritone will



be on stage for four Portland Opera productions this season. Alex completed his August singing as a soloist with the Oregon Symphony at its Waterfront Concert on the 28th of that month. Mr. Elliott's recital date is May 12, 2015.

For many Guild members, and others involved with Portland Opera, the Resident Artist Program is the most important aspect of the Company's undertaking. Indeed, the Opera Guild's major fund-

raising event each year is to support this very fine program! Moreover, how exciting it is to watch these young singers grow as artists.
